5.	<b>Description of content:</b> This import health standard allows for the importation of dairy products not for human consumption from Japan (i.e. dairy products intended for animal consumption or industrial use). These products are eligible for entry to New Zealand provided they are accompanied by zoosanitary certification attesting to the following: (a) Japan has been free from foot-and-mouth disease for the 3 months immediately prior to manufacture and export of the dairy products. (b) The dairy products have been heat treated (pasteurized) for a time and at a temperature recognized as effective for destroying pathogenic organisms.
