5.	Title, language and number of pages of the notified document: Proposed Amendment to the Food and Drug Regulations (1394 — Famoxadone) (available in English and French; pages 3181-3184)
6.	Description of content: Under authority of the <i>Pest Control Products Act</i> , the Pest Management Regulatory Agency (PMRA) of Health Canada has approved an application for the registration of the pest control product (pesticide) famoxadone as a fungicide for the control of early and late blight in potatoes and tomatoes. This proposed regulatory amendment would establish Maximum Residue Limits (MRLs) under the <i>Food and Drugs Act</i> for residues of famoxadone resulting from this use in potatoes and tomatoes, in order to permit the sale of food containing these residues. This proposed amendment would also establish MRLs in fat and liver of cattle, goats, horses and sheep, and in milk fat to cover residues in food derived from animals fed with crops treated with famoxadone. After the review of all available data, the PMRA has determined that MRLs for famoxadone of 1.0 part per million (p.p.m.) in tomatoes, 0.06 p.p.m. in milk fat, 0.05 p.p.m. in liver of cattle, goats, horses and sheep, and 0.02 p.p.m. in fat of cattle, goats, horses and sheep, and potatoes would not pose an unacceptable health risk to the public.
